A FATHER'S CONCERN

It goes without saying: a father's job isn't all that easy; neither is the responsibility of a mother.

They have entrusted to them the most precious things in the world, and that is children.

What they amount to or accomplish for good in this old world depends a great deal upon how fathers approach their responsibility.

One father who can well serve as a role model is described in Mark 9:17-29. Here a father brings an afflicted son to our Lord. He is seeking help. As you read these verses, you will see his concern reflected in several ways.

He gave priority to being a father. You will note that he brought his son (Mark 9:17). This is not a job left to the wife or mother.

He did not assume that this main responsibility was "make a living." He did not act as if he had no time for his son. His was not an attitude that such responsibility belongs alone to the mother. Not this man.

He took the time to bring the son to the Lord for help. Nothing else was more important.

He was aware his son had a problem. He doesn't ignore the fact that his son was afflicted.

He doesn't act as if this sort of thing goes with the territory. He could perceive that indeed there was a problem. He was an understanding father.

He knew his son and knew he had a problem. Have you heard the question, "Do you know where your children are?" This shows we ought to know something of our children's wherea-

bouts.

He Had Plans For His Son

Here is a father who planned to do all he could to see that his son received the best possible help.

He would pursue every avenue open to him to help his son. This man planned not to ignore his child's needs.

That has to mark him as successful father. He planned not to fail in his responsibilities. He might fail but it wasn't because he planned it.

Shouldn't our plans be to bring up our children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord (Eph. 6:3-4)?

Yes, this is a good picture of a father's concern, and we congratulate him because of his personal concern.
