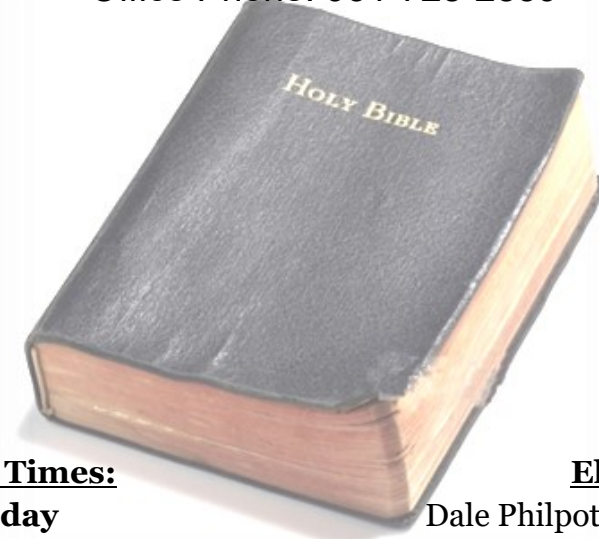

CONVICTION Or CONVENIENCE?

Acts 24:25 - There may never be a convenient season to please God. Governor Felix may have thought one would come. Did it?

Convenience: We are sorely mistaken if we think serving God will always be convenient or at least, ought to be.

Jesus said that being one of His disciples would cost dearly, cause changes in how you view relatives, require a cross to be carried, involve denial of self interests, etc. -

Luke 14:27-33. There will be tribulations that have to be endured (Acts 14:22), We will sometimes be “put out” or imposed upon in helping others, and things won’t always be to our liking.

In short, being a Christian is often inconvenient.

Conviction: Paul said that Chris-

tians ought to be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that their labor was not in vain. - I Corinthians 15:58.

The secret to overcoming inconveniences is being convicted, thoroughly convinced of the truth of God’s word and our need to obey it.

We will then be conscience bound to do all the Lord commands, regardless of how or what we think about it, or what inconvenience it causes.

How about you? Which of these two best describes your faith?

If convenient, then sooner or later you will fall. It is just a matter of time.

If convicted, then nothing will come in the way of you doing the Lord’s will.

Neither tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword, shall separate you from the love of God (Romans 8:35ff)!
