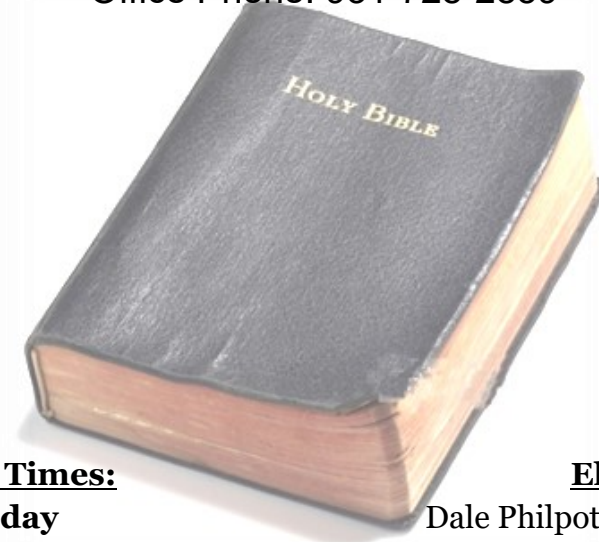

RESPONSES

If you look the word up in Webster's Dictionary here is what you find. "Something constituting a reply or a reaction".

Maybe we think of the word in a favorable way but a response can be in a favorable way or unfavorable way in as far as the word is concerned.

For instance In Acts 7, Stephen delivered a great speech and the ones who hear him responded with stones and of course the number of responses was great.

Paul delivered a great sermon on Mars Hill in Athens and, "*When they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked; but others said, we will hear thee concerning this yet again. Thus Paul went out from among them. But certain men clave unto him, and believed: among who was also Dionysius the Areopagite, and a woman named Damaris, and others with them.*" (Acts 17:32-34).

In this case the response was

mixed favorable and unfavorable. Some mock and some believed.

Usually when we read a bulletin we read of responses that are favorable.

But Luke reported both the favorable and unfavorable. Think about this; every time a sermon is given all the hearers on that occasion make some kind of response.

In view of this fact, the entire audience might be counted as "responses." It happened in Acts 2 when Peter gave the first gospel sermon.

We read where out of all the thousands present only 3000 responded favorably to the message and were baptized, (Acts 2:41).

The rest of the thousands responded unfavorable.
