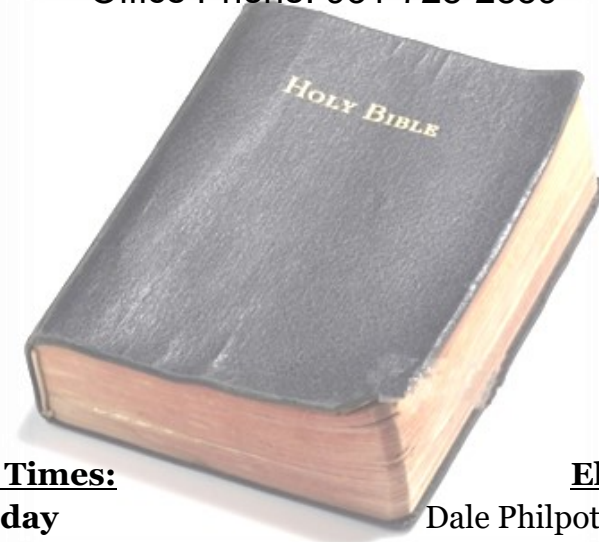

SEEKING THE PRIZE

“Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain. 25 And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible. 26 I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: 27 But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway” (1 Corinthians 9:24-27).

Every year sometime in March there is a sled race in Alaska, called Iditarod Trail Race. This race is 1,049 miles long from Anchorage to Nome. Those competing cover this great distance in anywhere from 8 to 15 days.

Back in 2011, a record was set by John Baker, who covered the route in 8 days, 19 hours, 46 minutes, and 39 seconds. This must have been a difficult race and one had to be steadfast both dogs and the

man handling them.

There was a cash prize and a new pickup truck. That may sound great, but I am sure the fact of winning was what he thought about more than the prizes he won.

The apostle Paul speaks of a race also. Notice what Paul says: *“And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things. Now they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible” (1 Corinthians 9:25).*

Those prizes won would soon be gone. The money would be spent, and the truck would rust, and decay, but the prize Paul spoke of is eternal.

We at times place our thoughts on the things that are temporal, things that will perish with time.

But the scriptures encourages us to focus and put our aim on that which is permanent.
