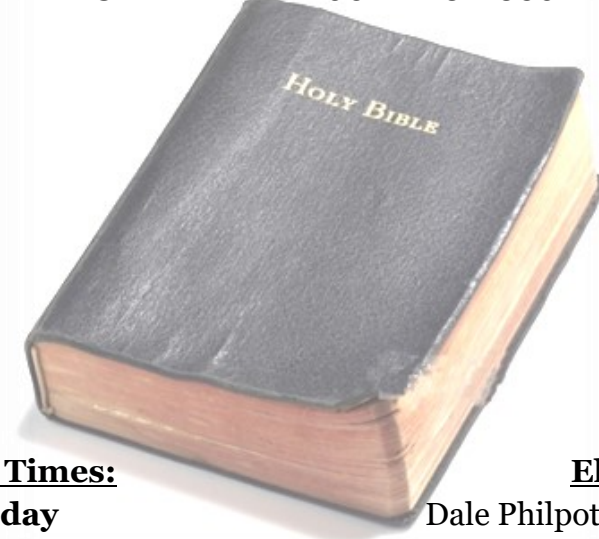

A POINT OF NO RETURN

The phrase "point of no return" originated as a technical term in air navigation, to refer to the point on a flight, at which a plane is no longer capable of returning to the airfield from which it took off.

We understand that our God is patient and full of mercy, but there is a line, so to speak, that must not be crossed.

It is dangerous to think that God will always continue to forgive, when one is persistent in doing wrong. According to Hebrews 12:29 *"For our God is a consuming fire."*

During the Old Testament times, the people that were to lead Ephraim, the ten northern tribes of Israel had passed what is called the point of no return.

They had become so ungodly and were so infatuated with pantheistic polytheism that there was no leader that was good. Not one sought to lead the people as God would have them to go.

They were engrossed in immoral practices, and deeply under the

occult powers behind these nature-god idols as to be irrevocably committed to them, so that it would be a waste of time and tears to try to reclaim them now.

Earlier in the Old Testament God said: *"My spirit shall not always strive with man"* (Genesis 6:3).

You also remember Jesus said: "Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind" (Matthew 15:14). *"Give not that which is holy unto the dogs, neither cast ye your pearls before swine"* (Matthew 7:6).

Pharaoh went so far that he reached a point of no return in hardened his heart to everything God said through Moses. (Exodus 8:15; 10:27).

In the book of Romans the Bible says: *"And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient;"* (Romans 1:28). When a person gets to the point that their conscience is seared as with a hot iron, passed feelings he might be at the point of no return. Something to think about. RH
