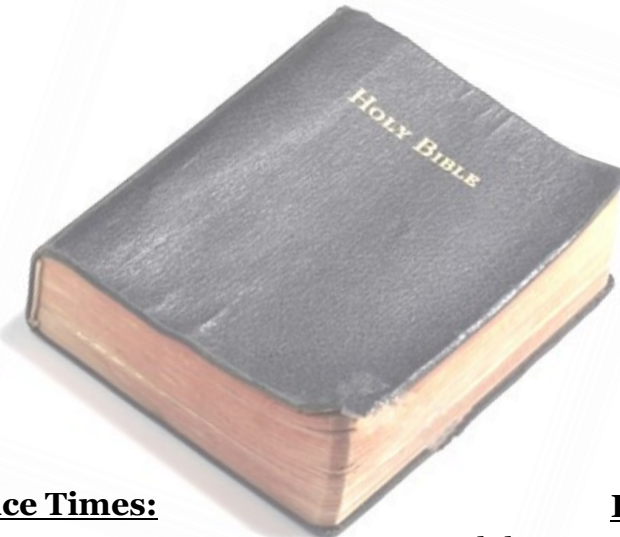

WHAT GOD SEES

What God sees is often different from what you and I see. There are so many things that are of value in the eyes of God that may not be to us.

For instance when Peter was writing about a wife he said this: *“But let it be the hidden man of the heart, in that which is not corruptible, even the ornament of a meek and quiet spirit, which is in the sight of God of great price”* (1 Peter 3:4).

Remember the prodigal son said this: *“And the son said unto him, Father, I have sinned against heaven, and in thy sight, and am no more worthy to be called thy son”* (Luke 15:21).

The father here is used to represent God the Father. We know the earthly father had not seen the son's sin but the Heavenly Father had.

In the book of Luke we have this recorded. *“And he said unto them, Ye are they which justify yourselves before men; but God knoweth your hearts: for that which is highly esteemed among*

men is abomination in the sight of God” (Luke 16:15).

I think, from just these few verses we can conclude that God sees all that we do every day of our lives. We do have a higher priority and that is pleasing God. Paul In the book of Acts placed a higher priority on what is pleasing in God's sight than what is pleasing in man's sight. (Acts 4:19).

In our prayers Paul told Timothy this:

“I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men; “2 For kings, and for all that are in authority; that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and honesty. 3 For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour” (1 Timothy 2:1-3).

Notice he says this is acceptable in sight of God. I close with this:

“And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight” (1 John 3:22).

So the scriptures says God sees all things.
