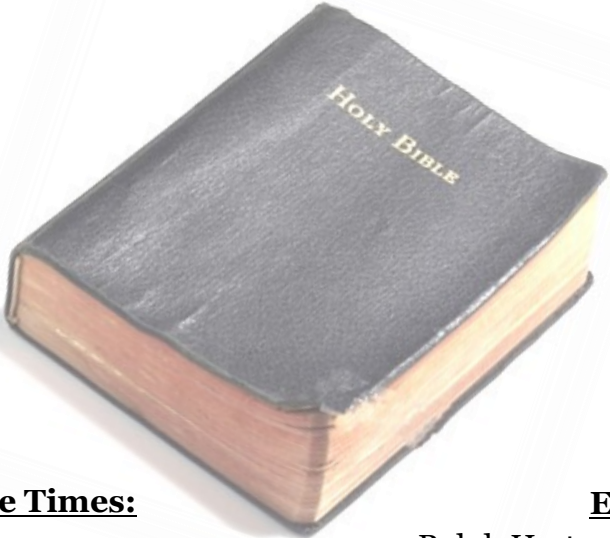

If you are like me, you want to believe that you can make a difference in the world, but sometimes a voice inside keeps saying I not sure. We make think well the current of evil is too strong so how can one person possibly change the course of the world?
