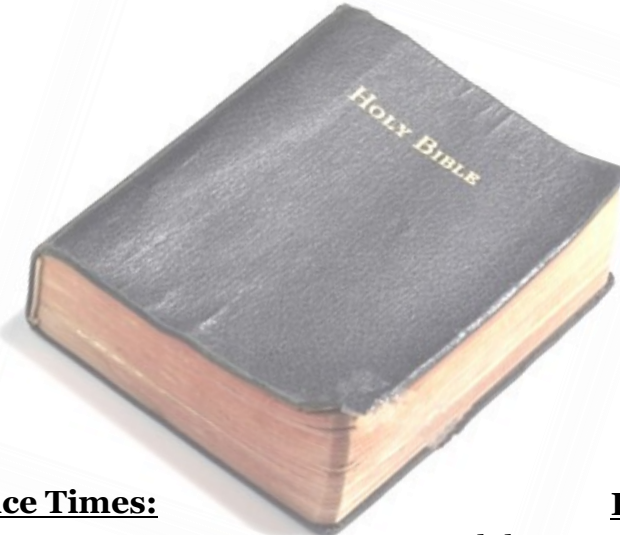

I WILL UPHOLD YOU

“Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness” (Isaiah 41:10).

There is a song that we sing at times titled “Jesus, Lover of My Soul”. This song, if you pay attention to the words, deals with life’s trials, and difficulties, but gives comfort because it presents Jesus as our Savior, and our refuge, and strength. Listen to the Psalmist; “God is our refuge, and strength, a very present help in trouble” (Psalm 46:1).

We have the Hebrew writer giving us this comfort also; “Let your con-

versation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. So that we may boldly say, The Lord is my helper, and I will not fear what man shall do unto me” (Hebrews 13:5-6).

Going through life we with its perils, and problems we may be helpless dealing with this on our own, but we have encouraging words. “Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need” (Hebrews 4:16).

In the Old Testament as it relates to Israel Isiah said this: “The eternal God is thy refuge, and underneath are the everlasting arms: and he shall thrust out the enemy from before thee; and shall say, Destroy them” (Deuteronomy 33:27).

When you consider God, and His power, and love, help from no one else is needed. “But thou, O Lord, art a shield for me; my glory, and the lifter up of mine head” (Psalm 3:3).
