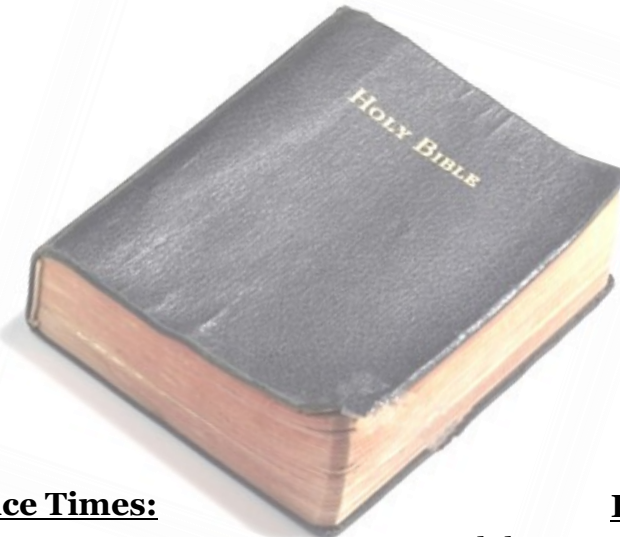

**IS YOUR LOVE FOR JESUS
SENTIMENTAL**

“He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him” (John 14:21).

Could it be true, that much of what you might call Christian is only professing one's love for Jesus? Could it not be a subjective sentimentality, with little Biblical content, or practical application, and devotion?

It is important for a Christian to love the Lord Jesus Christ, to sing, pray, and worship Him in truth and spirit. Paul said: “If any man love not the Lord Jesus Christ, let him be Anathema Maranatha” (1 Corinthians 16:22).

Does our devotion demonstrate that we love the Lord? What about when we are in worship, and during preaching, or even at other times you are on your phone looking up something, or just continuing to search for different things, and not listening to the word of God.

Or it could be several things that we allow our minds to be pulled away for what is taking place in worship. Is that really demonstrating a real devotion and love for our Lord?

You see the person that truly loves the Lord will focus their minds, and attention on what is being done, or said. The one who really loves Him is that Christian who has learned His commandments and obeys them. “If ye love me,” Jesus says, “he will keep my words” (John 14:23).

But on the other hand if our minds are focused on other things, would that not be an indication of a lack of love? Jesus said: “He that loveth me not keepeth not my sayings” (John 14:24).

Many excuses are offered by Christians when they fail to keep His word, but the reason most of the time is we are just not interested. It is a sin when we allow things that can be controlled by us to cause our minds to not be focused on worshipping God.
