THEY HEARD HIM GLADLY

Mark 12:37 “David therefore himself calleth him Lord; and whence is he then his son? And the common people heard him gladly.”

Isn't it a shame that in our day most people do not want to hear what Jesus has to say? The common people of Jesus day were willing to hear him.

There were those then of course that did not want to listen and made sly remarks about what Jesus had to say, but those with a good heart took the time to hear Him.
