The following poem was posted by Tom Childers on the "Friends of the Restoration" Facebook page on July 21, 2016. According to Tom, it was adopted from "Where the Sidewalk Ends" by Shel Silverstein.

"I cannot go to church today," Said little Peggy Ann McKay. "I have the measles and the mumps, a gash, a rash and purple bumps." My mouth is wet, my throat is dry, I'm going blind in my right eye."

"My tonsils are as big as rocks, I've counted sixteen chicken Pox "And there's one more— that's seventeen. And don't you think my face looks green?"
