BIBLE READING **December 20-26** **Matthew 1-Mark 4**

THE PSALMS

“The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament showeth his handiwork. Day unto day uttereth speech, and night unto night showeth knowledge. There is no speech no language; their voice is not heard.” (Psa. 19:1-3).

This passage is one of those that indicates that the realm of nature about us is testimony to the existence and power of God. Later in that same psalm the writer pays tribute to the “law of Jehovah,” the “testimony of Jehovah,” “the precepts of Jehovah,” and the “ordinances of Jehovah,” as further evidence of the greatness of God.

Moses, who is credited with being the author of the ninetieth Psalm has written, “LORD, thou hast been our dwelling place in all generations. 2 Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever thou hadst formed the earth and the world, even from everlasting to everlasting, thou art God. 3 Thou turnest man to destruction; and sayest, Return, ye children of men. 4 For a thousand years in thy sight are but

as yesterday when it is past, and as a watch in the night.” (Psalm 90:1-4).

Both the omnipresent and omniscience of God are revealed in the following:

“O LORD, thou hast searched me, and known me. 2 Thou knowest my downsitting and mine uprising, thou understandest my thought afar off. 3 Thou compassest my path and my lying down, and art acquainted with all my ways. 4 For there is not a word in my tongue, but, lo, O LORD, thou knowest it altogether. 5 Thou hast beset me behind and before, and laid thine hand upon me. 6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is high, I cannot attain unto it.” (Psalm 139:1-6.)

Isaiah 55: 8-9 continues this idea of God's superiority, “For my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, saith the LORD. 9 For as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways, and my thoughts than your thoughts.”

God has given us His word to guide us through life. Without it we would have no direction or path that leads to acceptability with God.
