Encouragement for the Fearful

“But now thus saith the Lord that created thee, Fear not, for I have redeemed thee” (Isaiah 43:1).

Strange fears possess the souls of many. Even the great ones of the earth have not been free from them.

A Dr. Johnson, with all his philosophy, was very careful not to enter a room with his left foot foremost. If by any chance he did so, he would immediately step back and re-enter with his right foot foremost.

He was terribly afraid of death, too,

and would not suffer it to be mentioned in his presence.

Julius Caesar, to whom the shouts of thousands of the enemy were but sweet music, was mortally afraid of the sound of thunder, and always wanted to get underground to escape the dreadful noise.

Marshal Saxe, who loved to look upon ranks of opposing armies, fled and screamed in terror at the sight of a cat.

Peter the Great could scarcely be persuaded to cross a bridge, and whenever he placed his foot on one he would cry out with fear.

The number 13 is considered by some an unlucky number, and the breaking of glassware, is a harbinger of misfortune. By the way there is no 13th floor in any building that I know of.

Other fears possess the mind at times. Strange fears of impending disaster, or coming sorrow, of threatening calamity; fears sometimes that remain inarticulate, but which weigh like a load of lead upon the soul.

Even sometimes Christians have these kinds of fears. But the Lord says to such: “But now thus saith the Lord that created thee, Fear not.” Suffer not such fears any longer to enthrall you.
