THE POWER OF PRAYER

What we have in prayer is what we might call today “wireless” communication. Maybe to some, it somewhat a mystery, but it does exist and we have it available to us on a daily basis.

There are conditions to prayer. One is the will of God. “This is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will He heareth us, and if we know that He hears us we know that we have” (1 John 5:14-15).

Of course we must pray in the name of Jesus. “Whatsoever you shall ask in my name, that will I do; that the Father may be glorified” (John 14:13-14). As we very well know no man can come to the Father but by Jesus.

There are some things that will hinder the effect of our prayers. Notice some common things.

Selfishness. “Ye ask and receive not because you ask amiss; that ye might use it for you own pleasure” (James 4:3).

We ask amiss when we ask anything for the honour and exaltation of self. To many this might be a subtle and powerful temptation.

Secret Sin. “If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear me” (Psalm 66:18). Let us see that first of all, our souls are “cleansed from secret fault.” We must remember the “searching eyes of the Lord” (2 Chron. 16:9).

Unbelief. “He that cometh to God must believe” (Hebrews 11:6). “Let not that man that wavereth in his trust think that he shall receive anything of the Lord” (James 1:7).

An Unforgiving Spirit. “When ye pray, forgive; if you do not forgive, neither will your heavenly Father forgive you” (Mark 11:25-26). No use praying if harbouring a grudge against any one. We must forgive one another, as Christ forgave us (Colossians 3:13).

Impatience. “He is the rewarder of them that diligently seek Him” (Hebrews 11:6). Abraham prevailed because he staggered not at the promise of God (Romans 4:20). We must be like the widow who prevailed with the unjust judge because of her importunity, and Jesus added: “Shall not God avenge His own which cry day and night unto Him, though He bare long with them?” (Luke 18:1-7). I tell you that He will (v.8).

May we be fervent in our prayers believing that God will answer in due time.
