BE NOT DECEIVED

Galatians 6:7 “Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.”

I was reading an article about sixth grade students working independently on math questions. Each student is to receive help as he or she needs it. One student, had always been a step behind the others.

Now this one was in mid-stream with his peers, but he never ask one time for any guidance. With careful observation the teacher, noticed that he borrowed other students’ papers and polished off the work in a hurry!

A couple of times the teacher ask if he understood the new concepts, and he assured the teacher he did. In six days, the testing time arrived and this boy came face to face with one simple fact: he had deceived himself into honestly believing he

had understood the work.

He had boasted believing he had understood the work. He had boasted to everyone that the problems were simple and that he could zip through one in an evening.

At the quiz, he was completely on his own; he had not deceived the teacher or his peers and his self-deception was short lived!

He had sown seeds of dishonesty and laziness and he reaped shame and failure.

We all have what this boy had inside us, only self-examination in light of God’s Word, will help us uncover our self-deception.

We may fool others but we will never fool God because all things are open to his eyes and ears.
