LORD OF HOSTS

1 Samuel 1:3, “ And this man went up out of his city yearly to worship and to sacrifice unto the LORD of hosts in Shiloh. And the two sons of Eli, Hophni and Phinehas, the priests of the LORD, were there.”

This name of God, “Lord of host” (Hebrew, Jehovah Sabaoth), occurs many times in the Bible, first in the text quoted above.

It might be noteworthy that Elkanah, the father of Samuel, understood this name of God better than did the wicked priests, the two sons of Eli.

The same occurs only once in the New Testament, speaking of oppressed laborers crying to “the Lord of Sabaoth” (James 5:4).

A similar name, “God of hosts, occurs several times, the first in Psalm 80:7: “Turn us again, O God of host, and cause thy face to shine, and we shall be saved.”

The combined name “Lord God of hosts” is used about 25 times, first in 2 Samuel 5:10: “And David went on, and grew great, and the Lord God of hosts was with him.”

In all the times these terms are

used it is used to emphasize the mighty power of God and His great host of angels “that excel in strength, that do His commandments” (Psalm 103:20).

Not only is God Himself omnipotent and omniscient (of course He is creator of all things!), but He has “an innumerable company of angels” (Hebrews 12:22) at His call. These mighty hosts have actually been seen by men, as in the days of Elisha (2 Kings 6:17), and at the birth of Christ (Luke 2:13).

More than these the great “Captain of the host of the Lord” (Joshua 5:14) is none other than the Lord Jesus Christ. He and He alone, is the true “Lord of hosts.”
