*"These all died in faith."
Hebrews 11:13*

What would you like to have recorded on your tombstone?

When you read this passage you read that all of those blessed people of God who died in the Lord whether by old age or violent means all died in faith.

In faith they lived their lives. It was their comfort their guide, their motive and their support and in faith they died, ending their lives with peace of mind even though many died a martyrs death.

They did not die resting in the flesh or upon their own attainments; they made no advance from their first acceptance with God, but held to the faith to the end. Faith is as precious to die by as it is to live by.

Dying in faith believing the promises which God had made to them having their sins blotted out because of the grace, mercy and love of God that had been manifested in God's Son.

They had submitted to the will of God in whatever dispensation they live under.

Dying in faith has to do with the present. These individuals were confident of their acceptance with God, they enjoyed His love, and rested in God's faithfulness.

Dying in faith looks into the future also. They died with the assurance that the Messiah would be the means of them coming forth from the grave and would be able to behold Him face to face in Heaven.

To them the pains of death were to be rejoicing because of what they would gain. Paul said for me to die is to gain (Phil. 1:21).

Therefore the life we live is to be one of faith to the end. Paul said: For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God (Eph. 2:8).

Of course we need to understand this is an obedient faith and not just faith only. Our faith is in the Lord Jesus Christ who according to Hebrews 12:2

Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.
