WHAT DO WE LONG FOR?

1 Thessalonians 1:10 “And to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, even Jesus, which delivered us from the wrath to come.”

The church at Thessalonica had turned from idols to serve the living God; not only that, but to wait for His Son from Heaven.

In the Old Testament on the Day of Atonement the High Priest went into the Most Holy Place to offer the blood of animals for atonement.
