Barnabas—Building up Christians

Acts 11:20-26

Antioch was the first integrated church. Half-breed Jews had been converted in Samaria (Acts 1:8ff.) and Gentiles at Caesarea (Acts 10).

Here in Syria, Jews and Gentiles first united in one congregation. Imagine the powder-keg possibilities!

Jewish Christians would be jealous for their traditional heritage. Gentile Christians would exult in their new

status.

Both could well rub the others' feelings raw. Tensions might have built to explosive heat.

It would take a special kind of leader to bring off such a merger. A small man with narrow views could have split the Antioch church down the middle.

Who better could bridge that culture gap than **Barnabas**? A good man, full of faith and the Holy Spirit. Look at Barnabas' method: He was glad at what God's grace had done.

He had no petty partisan prejudice, just joy that men who loved the same Lord also loved each other.

Then came team teaching. Barnabas and Paul working together! Sharing equally to instruct new Christians.

Results? Many converts! (Acts 11:24). A loving readiness to share! (Acts 11:27-30). A missionary church! (Acts 13:1ff).
