OUR CHILDREN

The responsibilities involved in raising children in an increasingly godless world will continue to be a difficult problem and a deep concern for the development of our children.

Challenges for Christian parents are difficult in meeting the moral, physical, mental, and emotional needs of their young people.

And it will be increasingly more complex it seems as time goes on. How will children be guided with regard to the media's influence, mag-

azines, movies, television, music and the electronic media?
