The New Testament is Credible!

Of course we understand that it is credible, because it is inspired. But it is also credible because of the eye-witnesses as to what they related, they were companions of Jesus, and participants in the early spread of the gospel.

Most historians are compelled to collect their facts from former documents, from tradition, and from participants removed from them by several generations.

The New Testament books must be placed in the highest class of reliable histories because of the eye-witnesses who were there and saw and heard.

These witnesses give facts about what they saw and heard, not inferences and theories. If they gave inferences it might have been incorrect, but in regard to what they saw and heard they could not have been mistaken.

The miracles done, stand out. Jesus and his disciples were at the marriage in Cana, when the wine was exhausted, the vessels were filled with water, it was then presented as wine to the

guests and they said it was the best used at the feast.

These are facts given by witnesses, and from these facts, and not from the claim of the witnesses, we learn that a miracle was wrought.

Again, in the resurrection of Jesus, we have the facts—the arrest, trial, crucifixion, death and burial; all these were events; as well as the visit to the tomb.

The empty sepulcher, the meeting with the Savior, the exhibition of his wounds, and the many infallible signs, proving that the New Testament is credible.

They gave us these facts that cannot be denied. Jesus said what would happen and it did, as he said.

Those witnesses' record for us the facts and events that transpired of what they saw and heard but also and more important what they were directed to write by the Holy Spirit sent to them to guide them into all truth.

There could be no mistake that the New Testament is credible and we can trust in it with all our hearts, knowing it is God's word to teach us what we must know in order to be acceptable and pleasing in His eyes.

It teaches us what we must do to be saved and go to heaven. If one will only follow the Bible, he or she won't be lost. Trust it!
