## A BROKEN HEART

Psalm 147:3 *“He healeth the broken in heart, and bindeth up their wounds.”*

It is a very common thing to have a broken heart at the present day. Perhaps this has always been in the world’s history.

Heart-break is not a rare and tragic episode in human experience. There is a difference between being broken-down and broken-hearted.

Broken-down people are not always broken-hearted folks. We have known some who were broken in health, broken in wealth, even broken in love, yet not broken-hearted.

We have heard of people who have died of ruptured heart. Through brooding over sorrow they say I am heart-broken.

Meaning a great and overwhelming grief. I remember my grandmother died early in the year and I really believe my grandfather had a broken-heart.

He suffered being alone since they had been together for so many years. He died the same year. Even though he was a Christian man and trusted in God he was suffering a broken-heart.

But, when it comes to the world, such are hopeless. Science has to a great extent conquered physical pain.

As we know, science has done nothing to diminish mental pain. Christian Sci-

ence, which is no science at all, seeks to cure by leading people to ignore it which is a funny sort of cure isn’t it?

There are various causes for heart-break. Broken by grief which is suggested in Psalm 147:3 (for “wounds,” margin has “griefs”).

Grief through bereavement. Grief through loss and sorrow. Everyone deals with this in different ways. Sometimes people will say why don’t they get over it?

Well they are not understanding how people view loss. And it is not because that person is not a believer but, each one deals with loss different.

We never “get over” losing a loved one, but, with God’s help, we get “through it”.

Sometimes people have broken-hearts due to failure and other because of sin. Psalm 51:17 “The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit: a broken and a contrite heart, O God, thou wilt not despise.”

The thing we need to remember is that Christ can heal a broken heart. We just need to trust him to help us to overcome.
